“Lasting Impressions” By Paulette Chernack and Cassandra Davidson

Meet the author, Paulette Chernack and the illustrator, Cassandra Davidson, a mother/daughter team, of *Lasting Impressions* and learn how to decode the iconology found on New England gravestones including some of Kittery's finest stone carvings. Paulette will also read an excerpt from their book. Cassandra will demonstrate the proper technique for rubbing gravestones, including a hands-on mini-workshop.

Rubbings will be on display. The new full color book, published by Peter E. Randall Press, will be available for purchasing and signing as well as their Gravestone Rubbing Kit.

After many years of research, they created *Lasting Impressions*. It includes over 300 of their images presented as rubbings and photographs, an extensive index from A to Z illustrating the symbolism carved on gravestones, information about how to properly rub a gravestone, important conservation and preservation notes, and a comprehensive study guide for educators.

This program is free and open to the public.


